In 2000, 16 individuals gathered to form the Wetaskiwin Genealogical Society. The group applied to Alberta Genealogical Society and was accepted as one of its 10 branches.

Over the years the WGS has put on several genealogical workshops for the public. In 2006, it hosted a conference for AGS members from across the province.

In 2020, plans were finalized for another provincial conference in Wetaskiwin when the COVID-19 pandemic closed down all public gatherings. Undaunted, the local group switched gears and in 2021 presented the previously planned conference online... to a record number of AGS attendees.

One of the branch's early endeavors was to advocate to the local Latter-Day Saints Church that the innumerable genealogical resources at Salt Lake City be available here. In 2004, the Family History Centre was opened at the Wetaskiwin LDS church. The genealogical records, as well as other databases can now be accessed online by genealogists here in Wetaskiwin.

Recognizing and using valuable resources in many archives across the continent, in 2016 the society began advocating for the preservation of the Wetaskiwin City Archives, as the building in which it is housed was put up for sale. Now that Archives is managed by the Wetaskiwin District Heritage Museum Centre, society members volunteer to assist museum staff.

WGS will be celebrating 25 years of these and other accomplishments of individual members on May 31.

The event will be held at the Wetaskiwin Seniors Centre beginning at 10:30 am. Admission is free, but pre-registration is required. To register, email wetaskiwingenealogy25@gmail. com or call 780-360-7332.

Leah Johns, Archives Director at the Heritage Museum gave updated information on the City Archives which are now managed by the Heritage Museum.
